Locavore Tour

Locavore – the 2007 word of the year by the American Oxford Dictionary, is defined as someone who primarily eats foods from their local area-commonly within 100 miles. By eating locally, most locavores hope to create a greater connection between themselves and their food sources, resist industrialized and processed foods, and support their local economy. Since Harford County is in such close proximity to several major East Coast cities, our strong agricultural and family businesses offer many locavore shopping opportunities.

Our tour begins at Broom's Bloom Dairy to pick up some fresh milk and eggs and sample the homemade ice cream. Travel through Churchville to Brad's Produce to pick up some locally grown produce and grain fed, tender, tasty, natural beef by Hickory Chance Beef. All beef from Hickory Chance Beef is raised naturally with no feed additives other than their home grown corn and roasted soybeans that are ground to make dry feed. Continue your shopping, driving towards Havre de Grace, stopping at Keyes Creamery for homemade cheese.

Time to pick up some wine at Mt. Felix, The Ianniello family is proud to introduce you to their vineyards, where the soil is fertile and well drained. Take a stroll through the gardens at Mount Felix Manor where mature and unique trees are complemented by sunsets, moonlight and a constant Chesapeake Bay breeze.

End your day in bayfront Havre de Grace with a stroll on the promenade or shop the antique stores and art galleries. Enjoying the seafood buffet about the Lantern Queen makes a peaceful, scenic end to your day.
